# RE-ORGANIZATIONAL MEETING OF THE BIG STONE COUNTY BOARD January 2, 2018

The Big Stone County Board of Commissioners met in the Commissioner's Room at 8:30 AM on Tuesday, January 2, 2018. Chairman Backer called the meeting to order with Commissioners Athey, Berning, Olson and Sandberg present. Also present were Dillon Dwyer of the Ortonville Independent and County Auditor Michelle Knutson. The Pledge of Allegiance followed.

Upon call for nominations for Board Chairman, Commissioner Berning nominated Commissioner Olson. Following 3 calls for further nominations, motion by Athey, seconded by Sandberg and carried to cast a unanimous ballot for Commissioner Olson for Chairman. Outgoing Chairman Backer turned the meeting over to newly-elected Chairman Olson.

Chairman Olson called for nominations for Vice Chairman. Commissioner Athey nominated Commissioner Sandberg. Following 3 calls for further nominations, motion by Berning, seconded by Backer and carried to cast a unanimous ballot for Commissioner Sandberg for Vice Chairman.

Motion by Berning, seconded by Sandberg and carried to approve the minutes of the December 19<sup>th</sup> regular meeting.

Motion by Backer, seconded by Berning and carried to approve the agenda.

The bids received from the Ortonville Independent and the Northern Star for publishing those notices as legally required were reviewed. Motion by Athey, seconded by Sandberg and carried to accept the bid and surety bond of the Ortonville Independent as the official newspaper of the County for 2018. The Northern Star will publish second notices as required by law.

Attorney Glasrud provided an update on the upcoming closing for the land purchase for Highway. Motion by Berning, seconded by Backer and carried to execute the Purchase Agreement as presented by Attorney Glasrud.

Motion by Athey, seconded by Berning and carried to execute the county attorney service agreement with the City of Barry as presented by Attorney Glasrud.

Athey – HRA

IT Director Terry Ocaña provided an update on the safety grant that was received for updating security in the Courthouse. Motion by Sandberg and seconded by Berning to authorize up to \$15,000 for cameras and software and up to \$10,000 for wiring and installation. Following discussion, motion carried.

IT Director Ocaña reported that the County was approved to spend \$22,000 through a regional NG911 grant administered by the Central Minnesota Emergency Services Board. Motion by Sandberg and seconded by Backer to authorize up to

\$20,000 for ProWest to move forward in getting the County's 911 database in compliance. Following discussion, motion carried.

Motion by Sandberg, seconded by Berning and carried to approve a 6-month contract with ProWest for application development for departmental needs pending the approval of Attorney Glasrud's review. IT Director Ocaña reported the contract is for 4 days a month and that the Land Records Committee will reassess every month during the length of the contract.

Countryside Public Health Administrator Liz Auch introduced Megan Boutain, who has joined the agency as a nurse. Auch reviewed a flier on Health Equity and presented statistics on obesity. Boutain led those present in a game called *Making Choices – How will you invest your resources?*

WHEREAS, M.S. 388.21 requires that the County may provide that the office of the county attorney shall be a full-time position and require that one elected to the office not engage in the private practice of law.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Big Stone County Board of Commissioners hereby makes the position of County Attorney in Big Stone County a full-time position.

Motion by Sandberg, seconded by Athey and carried to adopt the following resolution:

### 2018-02

WHEREAS, Minnesota Statutes require a county board to establish the minimum salary for those officials for whom filing for office opens in May; and

WHEREAS, in May of 2018, filings will open for the elected positions of attorney, auditor, recorder, sheriff and treasurer.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Big Stone County Board of Commissioners, the minimum annual salary for all said positions be hereby established at \$25,000.

Motion by Berning, seconded by Athey and carried to approve the 2018 aggregate gravel tax budget with revenues estimated to be \$120,000.

### 2018-04

BE IT RESOLVED by the Big Stone County Board of Commissioners that the County Highway Engineer is hereby instructed to hire such miscellaneous and semi-skilled labor and such machinery and equipment as may from time to time be required at the prevailing rates in the community.

# 2018-05

BE IT RESOLVED by the Big Stone County Board of Commissioners that the County Highway Engineer is hereby authorized to purchase gravel material from various pits at the prevailing rates for graveling and re-graveling the Big Stone County roads.

#### 2018-06

WHEREAS the Big Stone County Board of Commissioners recognizes the need to be helpful to cities and townships during an emergency situation or natural disaster. THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Big Stone County Board of Commissioners that the County Highway Engineer is hereby authorized and instructed to pay by regular payroll and equipment rental rates up to the amount of \$10,000 for approved labor and equipment assisting cities and townships off of the regular County Road System.

## 2018-07

BE IT RESOLVED by the Big Stone County Board of Commissioners that the County Highway Engineer is hereby authorized and instructed to impose weight and load restrictions as he deems necessary on any or all County Roads and County State Aid Highways pursuant to Chapter 500, Article 4, Section 1, Subdivision 3 of Laws of 1959.

#### 2018-08

BE IT RESOLVED by the Big Stone County Board of Commissioners that the County Highway Engineer is hereby authorized to spray weeds and objectionable vegetation in all of the County Ditch Systems without further approval of the County Board of Commissioners so long as expenditures do not exceed \$2,500 for any single County Ditch. This resolution excludes Joint Ditches.

Commissioner Backer presented a letter from the Beardsley First Responders requesting an appropriation for 2018. Following discussion, motion by Athey, seconded by Backer and carried to authorize \$1,000.

Motion by Sandberg, seconded by Backer and carried to approve the list of depositories for the County as presented by County Treasurer Cindy Nelson.

Treasurer Nelson presented investment information and fund balances for 2016 and 2017 for the Board's review.

HR Director Dawn Gregoire requested guidance from the Board on the format for upcoming department head evaluations. Consensus of the Board was to follow the same process as last year. The Board directed Gregoire to schedule planning sessions with each department head beginning in February.

Following a break, a work session was held to review information for setting elected officials' salaries.

Chairman Olson adjourned the meeting at 10:20 AM.
