RE-ORGANIZATIONAL MEETING OF THE BIG STONE COUNTY BOARD January 3, 2023

The Big Stone County Board of Commissioners met in the Commissioners' room at 8:30 AM on Tuesday, January 3, 2023. Chairman Klages called the meeting to order with Commissioners Athey, Zimmel, Olson and Sandberg present. Also present were Dillon Dwyer of the Ortonville Independent, Coordinator Pam Rud. The Pledge of Allegiance followed.

Upon call for nominations for Board Chairman, Commissioner Olson was nominated. Following 2 calls for further nominations, motion by Athey, seconded by Sandberg and carried to cast a unanimous ballot for Commissioner Olson for Chairman. Outgoing Chairman Klages turned the meeting over to newly-elected Chairman Olson.

Chairman Olson called for nominations for Vice Chairman. Commissioner Sandberg was nominated. Following 2 calls for further nominations, motion by Klages, seconded by Athey and carried to cast a unanimous ballot for Commissioner Sandberg for Vice Chairman.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Big Stone County Board of Commissioners designates as depositories the following financial institutions and designates the following as brokers and authorized investment holders:

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the County Auditor/Treasurer is hereby authorized to act and serve as county agent on any County accounts set up or active at any of the above financial institutions, brokers, or investment holders.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the above designations and authority conferred shall be and remain in full force and effect until written notice of any amendment or revocation thereof shall have been delivered to and received by the financial institution, broker, or investment holder at each location where an account is maintained and the financial institution, broker, or investment holder shall be indemnified and held harmless from any loss suffered or any liability incurred by it in continuing to act in accordance with this resolution.
