RE-ORGANIZATIONAL MEETING OF THE BIG STONE COUNTY BOARD January 4, 2022

The Big Stone County Board of Commissioners met in the courtroom at 8:30 AM on Tuesday, January 4, 2022. Chairman Backer called the meeting to order with Commissioners Athey, Klages, Olson and Sandberg present. Also present were Dillon Dwyer of the Ortonville Independent, Coordinator Pam Rud and Auditor-Treasurer Michelle Knutson. The Pledge of Allegiance followed.

Upon call for nominations for Board Chairman, Commissioner Klages was nominated. Following 2 calls for further nominations, motion by Olson, seconded by Sandberg and carried to cast a unanimous ballot for Commissioner Klages for Chairman. Outgoing Chairman Backer turned the meeting over to newly-elected Chairman Klages.

Chairman Klages called for nominations for Vice Chairman. Commissioner Olson was nominated. Following 2 calls for further nominations, motion by Sandberg, seconded by Backer and carried to cast a unanimous ballot for Commissioner Olson for Vice Chairman.

Motion by Backer, seconded by Sandberg and carried to approve the minutes of the December 21st regular meeting.

Motion by Olson, seconded by Backer and carried to approve the agenda.

The bids received from the Ortonville Independent and the Northern Star for publishing those notices as legally required were reviewed. Motion by Athey, seconded by Backer and carried to accept the bid and surety bond of the Ortonville Independent as the official newspaper of the County for 2022. The Northern Star will publish second notices as required by law.

Motion by Olson, seconded by Sandberg and carried to designate the County's website for the publication of transportation projects as allowed by MS §331A.12.

Motion by Backer, seconded by Olson and carried to adopt the following resolution.

WHEREAS, Minnesota Statutes require a county board to establish the minimum salary for those officials for whom filing for office opens in May; and

WHEREAS, in May of 2022, filings will open for the elected positions of attorney and sheriff.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Big Stone County Board of Commissioners, the minimum annual salary for all said positions be hereby established at \$25,000.

WHEREAS, M.S. §118A.02, subd. 1(a) states "The governing body of each government entity shall designate, as a depository of its funds, one or more financial institutions."; and

WHEREAS, M.S. §118A.02, subd. 1(b)(2) allows the County board to authorize the Auditor-Treasurer to make investments of funds under M.S. §118A.01 to 118A.06 or other applicable law.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Big Stone County Board of Commissioners designates as depositories the following financial institutions and designates the following as brokers and authorized investment holders:

- Minnwest Bank of Ortonville
- CenBank of Ortonville
- Frandsen Bank & Trust of Clinton
- First Independent Bank of Beardsley
- Star Bank of Graceville
- MAGIC Fund, managed by PFM Asset Management
- TD Ameritrade/Ehlers Investment Partners

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the County Board of Commissioners authorizes the Auditor-Treasurer to make investments of funds under M.S. §118A.01 to 118A.06 or other applicable law at any one or more of the above.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the County Auditor-Treasurer is hereby authorized to act and serve as county agent on any County accounts set up or active at any of the above financial institutions, brokers, or investment holders.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the above designations and authority conferred shall be and remain in full force and effect until written notice of any amendment or revocation thereof shall have been delivered to and received by the financial institution, broker, or investment holder at each location where an account is maintained and the financial institution, broker, or investment holder shall be indemnified and held harmless from any loss suffered or any liability incurred by it in continuing to act in accordance with this resolution.

WHEREAS, Minnesota Statute 471.38, allows for the use of electronic funds transfers as a means of making various payments; and

WHEREAS, a local government may make an electronic funds transfer for the following:

- a. For a claim for a payment from an imprest payroll bank account or investment of excess money;
- b. For a payment of tax or aid anticipation certificates;
- c. For a payment of contributions to pension or retirement fund;
- d. For vendor payments; and
- e. For payment of bond principal, bond interest and fiscal agent service charge from the debt redemption fund; and

WHEREAS, the County Board shall annually delegate the authority to make electronic funds transfers.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Big Stone County Board delegates County Auditor-Treasurer Michelle Knutson the authority to make electronic fund transfers.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Big Stone County Board of Commissioners that the County Highway Engineer is hereby instructed to hire such miscellaneous and semi-skilled labor and such machinery and equipment as may from time to time be required at the prevailing rates in the community.

2022-06

BE IT RESOLVED by the Big Stone County Board of Commissioners that the County Highway Engineer is hereby authorized to purchase gravel material from various pits at the prevailing rates for graveling and re-graveling the Big Stone County roads.

2022-07

WHEREAS the Big Stone County Board of Commissioners recognizes the need to be helpful to cities and townships during an emergency situation or natural disaster. THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Big Stone County Board of Commissioners that the County Highway Engineer is hereby authorized and instructed to pay by regular payroll and equipment rental rates up to the amount of \$10,000 for approved labor and equipment assisting cities and townships off of the regular County Road System.

2022-08

BE IT RESOLVED by the Big Stone County Board of Commissioners that the County Highway Engineer is hereby authorized and instructed to impose weight and load restrictions as he deems necessary on any or all County Roads and County State Aid Highways pursuant to Chapter 500, Article 4, Section 1, Subdivision 3 of Laws of 1959.

2022-09

BE IT RESOLVED by the Big Stone County Board of Commissioners that the County Highway Engineer is hereby authorized to spray weeds and objectionable vegetation in all of the County Ditch Systems without further approval of the County Board of Commissioners so long as expenditures do not exceed \$5,000 for any single County Ditch. This resolution excludes Joint Ditches.

Motion by Sandberg seconded by Olson and carried to rescind the Tobacco Ordinance that was approved on 12/21/21. Ashlie Wubben from Countryside Public Health presented options for revisions to the ordinance and will be reviewed at a future meeting.

Motion by Sandberg and seconded by Olson and carried to approve the Ortonville Prosecution Agreement.

At 9:17 AM Chairman Klages called for a recess in the meeting until 10:30 am when the County Attorney interview was scheduled.

The meeting resumed at 10:30 AM to conduct a County Attorney interview. Kelsey Stock was interviewed by the Board. Following the interview and discussion, motion by Backer, seconded by Olson and carried to offer the County Attorney position to Kelsey Stock continent on background study.

Chairman Klages adjourned the meeting at 10:56 AM.
