The Big Stone County Board of Commissioners met in the Commissioners' Room at 8:30 AM on Tuesday, February 20, 2024. Chairman Sandberg called the meeting to order with Commissioners Zimmel, Klages and Athey present.

Commissioner Olson was absent. Also present was Coordinator Pam Rud. The Pledge of Allegiance followed.

Motion by Klages, seconded by Zimmel and carried unanimously to approve the minutes of the February 6th regular meeting.

Motion by Zimmel, seconded by Klages and carried unanimously to approve the agenda with the addition of CP 006-001-024 2024 Seal Coat Project.

Motion by Klages, seconded by Sandberg and carried unanimously to approve the 2024/2025 State of Minnesota County Interagency Cooperative Agreement which covers the administration of child support, establishment of paternity and medical support liability programs between the State and Big Stone County.

Motion by Athey, seconded by Zimmel and carried unanimously to approve the 2024-2025 Child Support Cooperative arrangement with Family Services, Big Stone County Sheriff and Big Stone County Attorney.

Motion by Athey, seconded by Klages and carried unanimously to advertise for gravel crushing.

Motion by Klages, seconded by Zimmel and carried unanimously to award the 2024 Seal Coat project to Bituminous Paving in the amount of \$362,401.55.

Motion by Zimmel, seconded by Athey and carried unanimously to advertise for the paving portion of CSAH 1.
